## Dundee Day Summer Tournament 2015

**Date:** Sunday, May 24<sup>th</sup>, 2015

**Time:** 10.30am-4:30pm (pitch/venue time. First game starts at 10:40am, last game ends at 4:20pm)

Registration packs will be available in the admin tent from 10:00am.

Referees meeting will be held alongside the admin tent at 10:20am.

**Venue:** Dawson Park, Arbroath Road, Dundee DD5 1PJ. Use the car park at the end of Dunnottar Place if you can (turn right off the A930, down Fairfield Rd., left on Strathern Rd., and next left into Dunnottar Place). We'll be on the astro / near the West Pavillion (see map at end).

**Surface:** All games will be played on a nice, sand-based astroturf pitch: please wear appropriate footwear (**studded football-type boots are NOT allowed** – normal trainers or astro boots with miniature moulded rubber studs are fine).

**Showers / toilets:** We will have access to separate male and female changing rooms throughout the day, but there is only one set of toilets and showers. Shower-times will be rotated (M/F in 10-15 minute blocks) from 3:45pm.

**Plan / rules:** This will be a traditional, outdoor, single-day event for teams of 8 players each. Normal korfball rules will apply, without shot-clocks, but with rolling subs. This year we have a record entry of 16 teams. The format is a four-pool round-robin followed by two sets of cross-pool games against teams of a similar standard. Each team will get 7 games and should not play the same team twice. There are no half time breaks. Teams will be awarded 2 points for a win, 1 for a draw, and 0 for a loss in each game. Points determine places in each pool at each stage; points are NOT carried forward to subsequent stages. In the case of any ties on points at the end of any stage, head-to-head results will be used, then goal difference, then "5 plus sudden-death" penalty shootouts. ☺

**Food, drink & conduct:** This event is being held in a public place; so please behave appropriately at all times and help to build a good reputation for korfball in Dundee. In particular, **please respect the Park's no alcohol policy, and dispose of litter into the bins provided**. Food (BBQ'd burgers and home-made cakes) and soft drinks (most likely water!) will be available in exchange for donations to cover costs (we are not officially allowed to sell food in the Park). There is a large Sainsbury's nearby too, in the event of any shortages in the food & drink department.

**Referees:** There will be a referee's meeting at 10:20am (meet at the admin tent). Each team is expected to provide at least one referee. **The event will work best if each team has several referees and rotates them**, because otherwise there will be very little time to rest (for single refs) between games – see schedule below.

**Referee development:** Dundee's NGB, the Scottish Korfball Association, wants to encourage referee development at all levels, and SKA refereeing mentors and assessors will be available throughout this tournament. Any referees seeking assessment, reassurance or support should contact the organisers at the beginning of the day to schedule observation and feedback.

**Player conduct and discipline:** Referees will be encouraged to use Yellow (or Red) cards to clamp down on any form of misbehaviour, including disrespect and dissent (either verbal or gestured). There will be no fines or reports for Yellow cards, but two Yellow cards (in one game) is a Red card offence, and Red cards will be penalised by a ban for the rest of the day, and a report to the player's NGB.

**Schedule:** See following table. Each game ends 3 minutes before the next game or break is due to start (so the games in rounds 1 & 2 are 17 minutes, and round 3 games are 22 minutes maximum length). The start and finish times for games will be indicated by the air horn, however the referee's whistle will officially start and end each game. Teams and referees should be ready to set up divisions at least 2 minutes before the game start-times. Whenever a team has a game off, there's a high probability that they should be refereeing another game (hence the request to provide several referees).



# Dawson Park

Dawson Park is the result of a bequest in 1940, by Mr William Dawson of Broughty Ferry "For the purpose of providing playing fields, sports grounds or other recreational facilities and the upkeep and maintenance thereof...for the citizens of Dundee, and particularly those of Broughty Ferry." The ground was purchased from the Douglas and Angus Estate in 1949, and the park was opened in the mid 1950's.

The park has feature plantings, a sunken garden, and a formal cherry avenue along the north axis, which is particularly stunning in spring.

**Duntrune Demonstration Garden**, which aims to provide information and ideas for small gardens, is also located within the heart of the park.

**Opening times:** weekdays 9am - 3:30 pm  
weekend openings limited to programmed demonstrations



## Park Guidelines

We wish your visit to the park to be as enjoyable as possible. Please be responsible; follow these simple guidelines to ensure that others may also enjoy the park.

Please see main management rules for details.

1. Fires are not permitted (contained BBQs OK)
2. Cars are not allowed into the park, beyond parking areas.
3. Alcohol is prohibited in all of Dundee's public spaces.
4. Cyclists: please act responsibly towards other park users.
5. Golf / golf practice is not permitted in Dawson Park.
6. Dogs must be under close control or on a short lead, at all times
7. Dog Waste is a Health Hazard: NOT cleaning up your dog's mess can incur instant fines. (The Dog Fouling (Scotland) Act 2003)
8. Littering is punishable by instant fines.
