Code of conduct for junior members (updated September 28, 2021)

Dundee Korfball Club is committed to safeguarding and promoting the well-being of all its members. The club believes that it is important that members, coaches, administrators and parents associated with the club should, at all times, show respect and understanding for the safety and welfare of others. Therefore, members are encouraged to be open at all times and to share any concerns or complaints that they may have about any aspect of the club with either the Club's Youth Development Officer (*Nigel Cooper, 07817 640432*) or its Child Protection Officer (*Lauren McNair, 07527 407311*).

As a member of **Dundee Korfball Club**, you are expected to abide by the following junior code of practice:

- All members must act in the best interests of Korfball at all times, and not to act in any manner that is improper or brings the sport into disrepute.
- All members must play within the rules and respect officials and their decisions.
- All members must respect the rights, dignity and worth of all participants regardless of age, gender, ability, race, cultural background, religious beliefs or sexual identity.
- All members must abstain from using violent, threatening, abusive, indecent, or insulting words or behaviour.
- Members should keep to agreed timings for training and competitions or inform their coach or team manager if they are going to be late.
- Members must wear suitable kit, including indoor trainers, for all training and match sessions, as agreed with the coach/team manager.
- Members must pay any fees for training or events promptly.
- All members must clear up their own litter, and that of any teammates who forget to do so, after all events.
- Members are not allowed to smoke on club premises or whilst representing the club at competitions.
- Members are not allowed to consume alcohol or drugs of any kind on the club premises or whilst representing the club.
